Middleton Parish Council Chairman's Report

Update on the proposed traveller sites originally discussed at February's Parish Council Meeting.

The following report was read out at the March meeting.

As chair of the Middleton Parish Council, I feel it is important and imperative to clarify the situation around the proposed traveller sites in Middleton parish.

In fact, there has been a lot of unnecessary worry, concern and discussion in the village, after our February Parish Council meeting, where it was reported there were several sites under consideration for use as travellers' sites.

This was incorrect information. What had happened was one site had been submitted by a landowner, after the Borough Council requested any sites, which may be suitable for assessment as traveller sites, be put forward. The Borough Council, after appraising this site, found it was not suitable and did not put it forward for consultation, this was referred to as site E. The consultation document that was referred to at the Parish Council meeting did not consist of any sites in Middleton, for consideration. The sites that were referred to, in the widely distributed leaflet, were sites that had been put forward by the landowner too late to be to be appraised by the Borough Council, so therefore could not go forward to consultation. Sites that have not been consulted on properly cannot get through the process and so for the time being there are no sites allocated or proposed for Middleton and/or Blackborough End.

Looking forward. if any sites are appraised by the Borough Council and deemed to be suitable, even with mitigation, then they will have to go to a full consultation, which will give the Parish Council and indeed all residents the chance to put forward their comments and responses.

To reiterate, as it stands at the moment, there is no consultation on any traveller sites in Middleton parish. If by any chance, the sites do come up for consultation then at that point you will be invited to have your say and indeed the Parish Council would put forward their opinions.

Be assured the Parish Council will be monitoring this and will keep a very close eye on any future developments. They will also be asking our

Borough Councillors to report when and if any consultations on this issue are coming up or due.

If you have any questions around this then please do not hesitate to e-mail the Clerk on Clerk@middletonparishcouncil.org or come along to a Parish Council meeting which is always held on the first Wednesday of every month with the exception of January and August.

Our next meeting is our Annual Parish Meeting so please come along. The meeting is at **7pm on Wednesday**, **3 April** in the Village Hall.

This is not a routine Parish Council meeting, but rather an opportunity for all residents to find out what the Parish Council and other organisations have been doing on your behalf and to ask questions.

HOUSEHOLDERS GET FREE DIY WASTE FOR SMALL PROJECTS

Norfolk residents are now able to dispose of small amounts of DIY waste at Norfolk's Recycling Centres free of charge following changes made by Norfolk County Council.

The change applies to small-scale projects carried out by householders on their own home, allowing them to bring a maximum 100 litres (must fit into 2 x 50l bags) for free <u>or</u> one single item (maximum size of 200cm x 70cm x 75cm).

Each household is allowed four free visits with DIY waste every four weeks. Anything beyond this will still be charged at normal rates.

Traders must continue to pay for DIY waste.

EAST WINCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 12 MARCH

Since our last meeting, the resignation of Mrs S Crocker had been received. Mr Gareth Crocker was appointed to the Parish Council, but three vacancies still remain. Anyone interested in serving on the Parish Council should contact the Clerk, Bob Pannell, at bob.pannell1@btinternet.com.

Jim Moriarty (our County Councillor and Deputy Leader of the Borough Council) and Michael de Whalley (one of our Borough Councillors) were both in attendance.

Mr Moriarty reported that NCC Highways had given a firm commitment that it will, this Summer, undertake the necessary work: (a) to complete the pedestrian Trod on Gayton Road from the old railway to the Post Office; (b) to resolve the serious and longstanding flooding/drainage issues at that point on the Gayton Road; and also (c) that no additional costs arising from this work would fall to the Parish Council. The Parish Council welcomed this positive development.

Under the 10 Minute Open Forum for Parishioners, the Parish Council heard concerns from residents about the serious flooding which was regularly preventing access to and from their property. Councillors Moriarty and de Whalley undertook to provide the residents with the contact details of the relevant officials from both the Borough Council and the Internal Drainage Board who should be able to provide advice and assistance.

Councillors Moriarty and de Whalley both gave update reports on Borough Council developments.

As reported last time, a Whole Woodland Tree Preservation Order (TPO) has been served on the owner of the woodland at Pentney Woods. This will put a hold on any work to the trees approved through the earlier felling licence. Meantime, the Parish Council has applied to nominate the woodland as an Asset of Community Value.

Are you concerned about excess speeding through East Winch? The Parish Clerk reported that he had received safety fears from a resident about traffic speeding through East

Winch on Gayton Road and Station Road. The Parish Council thought it unlikely that any speed reduction measures would be introduced unless it could be demonstrated to the relevant authorities that this was a matter of widespread concern amongst residents. So, if you are concerned about excess speeding through our village, please contact the Clerk, Bob Pannell, at bob.pannell1@btinternet.com. NORTH RUNCTON NEWS



West Winch Growth Area (WWGA)

In the previous newsletter we reported that the planning application for the West Winch Housing Access Road (drawings for which were briefly exhibited at West Winch Primary School on 9th January), was due to be validated and made available for further scrutiny on the County Council planning portal by the end of January.

However, at this time of writing (9th March) the plans have still not been uploaded – and therefore we can assume they have not been fully validated. We are advised that their appearance is imminent. So please continue to check the portal at www.eplanning.norfolk.gov.uk

Earlier this week it was announced that the County Council would make no funding application for improvements to the Pullover roundabout junction – even though it is widely agreed the junction is not capable of handling existing peak-time traffic. The County Council feared 'reputational damage' for applying for more Department of Transport money (?!).

No doubt with weather improving and Easter looming, local residents will soon be able to witness the now annual gridlock at Hardwick and Pullover as our local road system fails to cope with the weight of existing road traffic.

One can only imagine what the situation will be like around Lynn as the new housing at South Wootton, Knights Hill and the WWGA is completed, but (spoiler alert) bypassing 1.5 miles of the A10 for £65 million pounds will not solve our basic problem of too much local reliance on private car transport.

The Local Plan examination hearings recommence on 26th March and representatives from North Runcton and West Winch Parish Councils will be attending to hear what the examiners make of the additional evidence BCKLWN have provided in relation to the Borough spatial strategy and in particular the WWGA.



Andrew (Andy) Bloomfield is an experienced Birdwatcher and Naturalist born at Holkham North Norfolk where he works as a Conservation Warden on the Holkham Estate.

A child of the 60's, Andrew was born on the Holkham estate, went to school in Wells and has For more information contact Paul Fuller or Alan lived his life in North Norfolk. He has been able to combine his hobby of Birdwatching with that of his career as a Warden on the Holkham National Nature Reserve - the envy of many I am sure! Andrew is also a singer of rock and roll, a former UK old School Wrestler and a dedicated father.

He wrote Birds of the Holkham Area in 1993 and had major contributions in the Birds of Norfolk 1999 and The Turn of the Tide 2005 along with many smaller articles in a range of ornithological journals. His illustrated talks and guided wildlife tours are always in demand.

Andrew's knowledge of the Holkham NNR is second to none, covering all aspects of Wildlife and Fauna within the Holkham estate. However it is as a "Birder" that Andrew excels and his ornithological observations and photography will I know be enjoyed by all.

Wednesday 29 May at 7.30pm The Meaning of Geese **Presented by Nick Acheson**

Nick grew up in North Norfolk squelching through salt marshes and cycling guite lanes in search of Wildlife and still enjoys that to this day. Since his earliest days he has been enthralled by Birds, Mammals, Insects, Plants and other creatures. Nick travelled to Bolivia for 3 months to participate in a study of migrant birds, 10 years later he came home from his 3 month stint having travelled the length and breadth of Bolivia, across South America and in Australia and India Wow!

Nick works for The Norfolk Wildlife Trust and is an Ambassador for the Trust promoting wildlife around the county of Norfolk. Nick is also the editor of the Norfolk Wildlife Trust "Tern" magazine. In February 2023 Nick published a book entitled "The Meaning of Geese" the story of seven lock down months 2020 / 21 during which he cycled 1200 miles around North Norfolk on his mother's 40 year old bicycle in search of Geese. "The Meaning of Geese" was judged the East Anglian Book of the year in 2023.

Nick is an experienced broadcaster with a wide range of credits. He has appeared on BBC, ITV, Channel 4 and many times on BBC Radio 4. I am sure that you will enjoy Nick's presentation and his exuberant enthusiasm which I'm sure will make this an evening to remember.
