Middleton resident, Edward Boon, had another successful year at the UK National Poultry Show held in Telford in November 2015. Edward picked up four trophies (pictured below) for his award winning Marans eggs, including Best Plate of Large Eggs, Best Marans Eggs and Most Points in Marans Classes.



His interest in chickens and eggs started over 40 years ago when his new wife, Gillian, suggested that it would be "nice to have some brown eggs". He did not keep chickens at the time, but quickly took the hint!

North Runcton/West Winch (NRWW) Neighbourhood Planning Update - January 2016

The work continues on preparing a Neighbourhood Plan that will assist in shaping the Borough Council's proposed development plans for North Runcton and West Winch.

You will remember that we held a consultation period for our pre-submission Neighbourhood Plan document last summer. We had a good turnout at two events and in all we received 13 written responses from statutory consultees, 2 from landowner/agents and around 100 submissions from local residents. Thank you to all that took the time to submit your comments.

We are now part way through analysing all those comments and making the necessary revisions to the plan before we submit the final document to the Borough Council. This has been complicated by the slow progress the Borough Council has made with their Local Plan for the District. Our Neighbourhood Plan must conform with the Borough Local Plan – and until the Local Plan is reaching a finalised state we are advised to 'hold' on the Neighbourhood Plan (!)

The Local Plan examination process was delayed until September as the Inspector asked BCKLWN for further information. We attended a two day hearing in October to discuss concerns about the proposals in our area. A number of significant modifications have been made by the Borough – including allocating land at Gravelhill for development when it had previously been safeguarded.

We have, this week, submitted more comments on the modifications proposed by the Borough – and it is probable that the examination Inspector may ask for further clarifications and information before he can determine whether the Local Plan is 'sound'. At best we don't expect the Local Plan process to be completed until early summer.

Nevertheless we are making progress and we feel confident that our Neighbourhood Plan can be ready for submission to the Borough Council by spring. We have also had the good fortune to receive further grant aid and with this we have appointed Modicum Planning (from Ely) to assist us in the final stages of this long and exhausting process.

Assuming we eventually get the Plan adopted – we can make no guarantees about how successful it will be in shaping future development – this is all a new process! We have no illusions that we have many battles ahead. However we hope that with the Neighbourhood Plan in place we will at least have some adopted policy in place to help get a better deal for local residents.

EDWARD'S CHICKENS

Having acquired some chickens, he developed an interest in exhibiting eggs and first entered the UK National Poultry Show in 1975. He has taken part most years ever since. He won overall best in show in 1979 and 2013 and, though not in those years he hastened to add, has been a judge four times.

Edward said: "The show attracts about 5,000 entries for birds, plus about 600 entries for plates of eggs. Plates can be for 1, 3 or 6 eggs and there are also classes for just the contents of a single egg. Usually about 400 people enter the competition and they come from all walks of life. For some reason there seems to be quite a few Vicars. The Prince of Wales also exhibits and I have been fortunate enough to come out on top when we have shown in the same class." The criteria for judging eggs are very detailed covering shape (which attracts the most points), size, colour, shell texture and freshness - which apparently can be judged by gently shaking the egg and listening for signs of any air pocket.

Marans are Edward's current speciality. Here he is pictured with one of his prize winning Marans.



They are in the premier league of chickens, much prized for producing consistently dark brown eggs. He likes them because they are fairly easy to keep and can be expected to produce about 150 - 200 eggs a year. He also

keeps Minorcas, which produce white eggs, and Plymouth Rock Bantams which lay tinted eggs. He has kept Araucana, whose eggs are unusual because they are blue on both the inside and the outside of the shell.

There have been many highlights over the last 40 years or so of exhibiting eggs. In the mid 1980s, Edward twice had the privilege of showing the Queen Mother round the poultry exhibition at the Sandringham Show. In addition to the National Poultry Show, Edward has exhibited at the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Show, winning best in show in the last two years, and the Scottish National Poultry Show. Unbelievably, he submits his eggs for the Scottish show by post - and most have arrived safely!

When asked for any top tips for those wanting to keep chickens, Edward suggested: "Decide whether you want them for the supply of eggs, in which case buy hybrids, or if you want to exhibit for which you will need pure breeds. Four or five hens should be plenty to get started, but keep their feet clean and dry or they won't lay."

East Winch Parish Council Update

On 10th December, the Parish Council considered an outline planning application for 10 houses along Gayton Road. Comment had been received by email that bungalows would be preferred to houses, but the Council approved the application, provided that there was a proper splay for the entrance to the field and that the footpath was continued to join up with the trod.

An application further extending a large extension to a cottage at West Bilney was not approved because the plans were confusing and seemed inaccurate.

The residents from three households in Station Rd attended the meeting on 4th January to protest about the outline planning application. In particular, they were angry that the proposed farm entrance had been moved further west, so that the houses were going to be closer to the back of Station Rd houses than they needed to be. There was also a proposal to remove a hedge which belonged to a house on Station Rd. Assurances were made that these concerns could be considered, bearing in mind the general benefit to the village, when the application for full planning permission was made, and worried residents were urged to keep in contact with the council. However, there is only a two week period for comment by the public and the Parish Council, so comments must be made in good time.

The Parish Council agreed to raise the precept to £12,500 in order to replace the existing lighting with LED lights which will be much cheaper to run and to maintain.

Other matters:

The clerk is to send a strongly worded letter to Highways, Henry Bellingham and others insisting on the need for further safety measures at the bend near the RSPCA. (This has now been done).

The contract between the Parish Council and Wilson Farms for the permissive path between Holland House and the right of way has finally been agreed and signed.

Samanda Davison has been researching the types of bench to put in the play area, but there has been no input at all from residents to tell us whether a bench would be welcome; whether it should include a picnic table or not. No-one came to the open meeting to discuss what should be done about the playground, and people's views are necessary if something is to be done.

A complaint was made that a tree overhanging the trod in Station Rd is obscuring the street light.

The next meeting, unless there are planning matters to consider, will take place on Monday, 7th March at 7.30pm.

Sibelco's answers to parishioners' questions have been received by email and copies are available from Nell Steele.

Clarification: In reporting on the meeting of 9th November, Nell wrote, 'the extension of silica sand mining was discussed'. This related to Norfolk County Council's future plans for the area, at present vague, and had nothing to do with Sibelco or their awaited planning application. Furthermore, the proposal wasn't discussed, but only mentioned, as there was a 6-week consultation period.

LENT AS A REFLECTION

As lent is considered to be little more than a joke in our context, so rather than putting my own idea or comment, I would like to put some Biblical verses for our reflection.

Jesus' experience of 40 days of fasting in the wilderness corresponds to Israel's experience of 40 years of testing in the wilderness (Duet. 8:2-3). He endured his testing victoriously and obediently. Moses also fasted and prayed for 40 days and nights on two occasions (Ex. 24:18; 34: 28).

"Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning. Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. Who knows? He may turn and have pity and leave behind a blessing-- grain offerings and drink offerings for the LORD your God." (Joel 2: 12-14).

"When you fast, do not look sombre as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show men they are fasting. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be obvious to men that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." (Matthew 6:16-18)

"Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time." (1 Peter 5:6)

So, as we enter the season of Lent, I am grateful for the saints and especially my Lord Jesus who has gone before me. Similarly, some of whom in the Bible discovered the blessings of giving up something in Lent, while others grew in their faith by adding a Lenten discipline. No matter what you do during this Lenten season, I pray that God will draw us closer to him, and prepare us for a fresh experience in our spiritual journey to Good Friday and Easter.

IS THE PARISH NEWS REALLY 40 YEARS OLD?

2016 may well mark the 40th birthday of the Parish News. The exact dates are at the moment a little uncertain, but about 40 years ago a decision was made to launch a home-made church magazine that would be distributed free to every home in Middleton and East Winch as the two parishes were then linked - as indeed they are again now.

Gillian Boon recalls that she was asked to edit the new magazine and her friend, Carol Atkins, did the typing. Gill says: "In those days, it was literally "cut and paste". The stencils were cut by Carol and the magazine was run off on an old Gestetner machine. The sheets were then collated and stapled and bundled for distribution." At the same time a network of distributors was established, some of whom like Ali South and others are still helping to distribute the Parish News 40 years later. A big "Thank You" to all concerned.

I will try to do some more digging, but please let me know if you were involved in those early days or have any other information about the origins of the magazine. It would be great to have any photos taken over the last 40 years which show how our villages have changed!




